

## DigiLocal Volunteer role description

You don't need to be a software ninja, or Prof of Complicated Maths.

We need people that are familiar with technology and able to support young people.

The core skills are around problem solving, and building resilience (not giving up at the first hurdle). We support young people from age 8 with the simple philosophy that fun, high quality, regular engagement with tech will help them prepare for their future.

We have a range of project guides that support young people (and mentors) through a series of projects in Scratch and Python. All the software we use is freely available online.

A club session lasts 1hr and usually runs from 6-7pm weekday evenings. Each venue will run once a week, but we have venues across the city region.

We provide all the equipment for physical sessions (laptops, power cables, etc). You should arrive before the club is due to start to set out tables and power up laptops but that usually only takes 5-10 min. You will also need to pack away at the end of the club but again, that's only a few minutes. You don't need to wipe equipment down, we do that for you.

All volunteers require an Enhanced DBS check (Disclosure & Barring Service). We can help arrange this through STEM Learning for free.
